


Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community (SRPMIC)



Qualitative Interviews

"It made me feel like. It just made me, it inspired me. Like, how did they do the things they do. How they accomplished things."

- 13 y/o female in 8th grade (Resilience and Cultural Identity)

"Yeah, I feel like I can fit in with everyone else now, even though I'm not the same color, color tone, because that's mainly the problem. People think I don't fit in because my color."

- 13 y/o male in 7th grade (Self-esteem)

"It was just talking about how the beans been passed down from generation to generation and how they're still around and how to plant them and how to take care of them. It was just very interesting...Yeah. And plus my mom likes planting stuff, too. So, I gotta learn more for her."

- 15 y/o female in 10th grade (Cultural Engagement)

Quantitative Surveys

Resilience

- Increase in mean resilience scores (p = 0.1608)
- Self-Esteem
 - Increase in mean self-esteem scores (p = 0.2682)
- Cultural Identity
 - Increase in mean cultural identity (p = 0.0022**)
