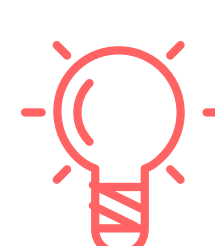
ALIGN

Many activities are considered cancer control including, but not limited to, nutrition, tobacco policy, physical activity, healthy behaviors, cancer screening and survivorship.

POWWOW CANCER EDUCATION BOOTH AND CANCER PLAY

Cancer education materials were available at the booth for community. A play was performed with sound and video recording for use in future cancer education events and promotion in the community.



COMMUNITY CANCER EVENT

There were presentations by cancer survivors and cancer control planning committee. Workgroups were formed to discuss and identify future cancer needs and actions.



CANCER SURVIVOR COMMUNITY WALK
